Sections of the Journal

Articles

Articles initiate, extend, and sustain scholarly conversations concerning the administration of academic programs in technical, scientific, and professional communication. They employ various methods of investigation, and range in length from 6,000 to 10,000 words. *Programmatic Perspectives* uses APA documentation style.

Emerging Scholars Forum (ESF)

This section highlights the work of graduate students and recent PhDs. ESF articles are peer reviewed. They should be between 6,000 and 10,000 words and conform to APA style.

Program Showcase Forum (PSF)

Program Showcase articles describe academic programs in technical, scientific, and professional communication to document changes in programmatic focus and to capture what is useful, interesting, and challenging about programs. PSF articles should be between 4,000 and 6,000 words.

Book Reviews

Authors are encouraged to submit reviews of books, software, and websites when such reviews illuminate the work of technical communication administrators who are interested in the theory and practice of program development and administration.

CPTSC Keynote

The first issue of each year will include the keynote presentation from the previous year's CPTSC conference. If available and approved by the speaker, audio or video clips will accompany the written text.

Editorials

The editorial section provides a brief respite from the demands of scholarly research. Editorials are short position statements, generally 2,000-3,000 words, written by any CPTSC member, including the editors of *Programmatic Perspectives*. Relevant programmatic or administrative topics that do not replicate position statements published in the proceedings will be considered for publication in the journal.
